

Manual Switches



- Too often don't get turned off, resulting in:
- Wasted electricity and energy and shortened bulb life
- Annoyed neighbors
- Environment blight

Not recommended

Time Clocks



- Turn lights on and off at preset time.
- Must be adjusted seasonally and after power outages.
- Involves running wires.

Not recommended

Photo Cells



- Turn lights on at dusk and off at dawn
- Leave lights on all night when not needed (light pollution)
- Shorten bulb life
- Waste electricity
- Are neighbor unfriendly

Not recommended

Programmed Switch



- Replaces wall switch
- Set your latitude and longitude
- Tracks the seasons
- Set each day's shut off time.
- Saves electricity & bulb life
- Is neighbor friendly

Motion Sensors



- Turn lights on when there are visitors or intruders at night, then turn them back off.
- Save electricity and bulb life
- Save money
- Are neighbor friendly
- Best solution when security is an issue

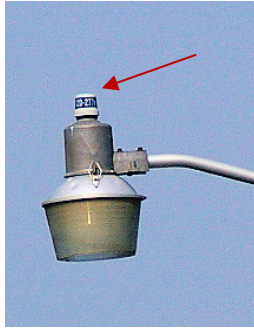
Interval Timers



- Turn lights on when you need them and off after preset time when you're finished.
- Save electricity and bulb life
- Are neighbor friendly
- Great for putting your pet out for, say, 10 minutes.

Recommended

Photocell Timers



- Barn (dusk-to-dawn) lights burn all night
- They're bad for the neighbors
- They waste electricity
- They're bad for the environment

Not Recommended



- Replace photocell with an easy to install *photocell timer*.
- Set it to shut off at, say, 11 p.m.
- It will soon pay for itself in energy savings.
- Buy at an electrical supplier
